Application to Bring Flora and Fauna Onto Wadjemup / Rottnest Island

Wadjemup / Rottnest Island (the island) is a Class A Reserve*. In order to protect the island's unique environment the transport of flora and fauna to the island is strictly regulated.

According to the Rottnest Island Authority (RIA) Environmental Policy anyone wishing to bring flora to the island including **wedding arrangements and bouquets** must fill in this form.

**ROTTNEST REGULATION 41B.
NO FLORA TO BE BROUGHT TO ISLAND**

- (1) In this regulation –
flora means any form of, or any part of, plant life or a fungus, but does not include anything intended for human consumption.
- (2) A person must not without permission cause or allow any flora to be brought within the limits of the island.
Penalty: a fine of \$1,000.
- (3) A ranger may take and destroy any flora that the ranger believes to be within the limits of the island as a result of a contravention of this regulation.

**41. NO ANIMAL OR BIRD TO BE LANDED
ON ISLAND**

- (1) A person shall not without permission cause or allow any animal or bird to enter within the limits of the island.
Penalty: \$1,000.
- (2) Nothing in this regulation applies to fauna that is indigenous to the Island, whether seasonally or otherwise.
- (3) A ranger may take and destroy any animal or bird that he believes to be within the limits of the island as a result of a contravention of this regulation.
